## 50 Years of Conservation, Education & Community Impact

Founded in 1974 as Berks County Conservancy; first easement accepted in 1975. Focused on land protection, environmental education, and historic preservation

Early work included historical asset documentation and public education programs, partnering with Berks County and the Historical Society

Shifted in the 2000s to focus on smart growth, water quality, and agricultural best practices, merging with the "Growing Together" initiative

Launched the Berks Urban Greening (BUG) program in 2004 to convert vacant urban lots into community gardens Ongoing work in land preservation, including stewardship of Neversink Mountain and other nature preserves and trail systems across the region

access, fill gaps, and promote
recreation

Launched annual **State of the Environment** report – analysis
of measurable data and trends

Launched **Eco-Camp**, an interactive summer camp serving over 950 children in two locations

Rebranded as **Berks Nature** in 2015, with a refreshed identity and expanded mission

Opened **The Nature Place** in 2017—LEED Gold certified HQ in Angelica Creek Park.

Launched Berks Nature
Preschool in 2018, licensed by
the state of PA for 65 children on
any given day.

Created "Camp for School" during COVID to support virtual learning and provide outdoor play for children of essential workers In 2021, received a \$25M endowment and \$3.5M capital gift to build The Rookery, a rooftop event space and green building showcase

- •State of the Environment Breakfast: Annual convening of community leaders, educators, and partners to highlight local environmental issues and conservation strategy
- •Community Events & Outreach: Host informal gatherings like "Green Drinks," creek clean-ups, and hikes to foster public awareness and volunteer engagement

•Berks Nature Ambassadors: Volunteer-driven initiatives for trail stewardship, educational outreach, and citizen science, including water testing and macroinvertebrate monitoring

Berks Nature seeks a dynamic, visionary **President** to lead the organization through its next chapter of growth and impact.

The President will serve as the **chief executive and public face of the organization**, providing strategic and operational leadership while championing Berks Nature's mission to connect people with nature and protect the natural resources of Berks County. This leadership role will guide an organization with 35 dedicated team members focused on advancing the organization's mission through land preservation, water protection, trail management, community gardens, education programs, Eco-Camp, and the State of the Environment report.



The ideal candidate brings at least ten years of executive leadership experience, preferably in a nonprofit, land trust, or conservation-focused organization that has undergone significant growth or transformation. The candidate will be an energetic, confident leader with an approachable, collaborative style and demonstrated skills in strategic decision-making, team development, and board governance.

As a **skilled spokesperson and relationship-builder**, the President will represent Berks Nature to diverse stakeholders, from partner organizations and funders to community leaders and public audiences. Internally, they will foster a culture of trust, learning, and collaboration while promoting staff development and organizational sustainability.

The successful candidate will demonstrate executive presence with the ability to **inspire**, **motivate**, **and engage** across diverse audiences. They will have a proven track record in management and will be a confident public speaker capable of serving as an effective external advocate for the organization.



The candidate will be skilled in financial and technology matters and bring strong **strategic thinking** and an **entrepreneurial mindset** to their work. Additionally, the candidate will have experience navigating organizational change, growth, and board partnerships.

Familiarity with conservation, land use, or environmental education is preferred but not required. Knowledge of Berks County or Pennsylvania's environmental landscape is also preferred, but not required.

- Robust financial and technology literacy;
- ❖ Ability to manage multiple projects independently and effectively;
- Proven success with fundraising and development; grant-writing experience is highly desirable;
- Strong entrepreneurial mindset and track record of problem-solving and negotiation skills;
- A successful track record of developing partnerships with organizations and community stakeholders;
- Bachelor's degree in a related field;
- Act 33 (child abuse), 34 (criminal history), 151 and 114 (FBI background) clearances or ability to obtain them;
- Experience in organizational governance and working with a volunteer board of directors is preferred.
